## A NEW WAY TO CAN TOMATOES?

Last summer I tried a new method of canning tomatoes, and it proved so satisfactory that I want to pass it on. Scald and peel the tomatoes as usual. Have the cans sterilized, pour in boiling water to fill the cans, so that all crevices are filled, then put on the cover. Place the cans in a boiler or large vessel, pour in boiling water till it reaches the neck of the can, put the lid on the boiler, wrap it with a blanket or rug, and leave until the water is cold, which will be next morning. The cans are then ready to put away. I did not lose more than forty quarts. When the cans are opened, the tomatoes were whole and firm enough to slice easily.—Woman's Home Companion for September.
