**EDITORIAL NOTES**

Judged by the postal revenues of the long list of towns given in another column, the only place to make materially greater progress than Oshawa during the past year was our neighbour, Midland. And they have local Option there, too!

Oshawa has just resolved to build a hospital. The suggestion came from a woman, and a strong committee took hold of the idea, and \$18,700 has been raised in two days this week.

Mayor Oliver, at one of the numerous temperance meetings in Toronto on Sunday, declared that the question of temperance should be made a political issue. He was of the opinion that the Provincial Liberal convention of 1910 should adopt as one of its planks "the abolition of the bar," and that he was ready to support any party that took such a stand.

Speaking at Massey Hall, Toronto, Sunday afternoon, Mr. Quincy Lee Morrow, of South Dakota, declared that every dollar spent in the bar comes out of the cash drawer of the general merchant. "When the business world," he observed, "gets behind the movement, the end of the traffic is in sight. Forty millions of the population of the United States, it was explained, are now under prohibition, and it had proved a success.

In direct disregard of the advice of some of its ablest and oldest members, such as Lord Rosebery, Morley, Chamberlain, James of Hereford, Balfour of Burleigh, the Earl of Lytton and the Archbishop of Canterbury and York, the House of Lords at London on Tuesday created a situation unprecedented in English history, at least in three hundred years, by refusing formal assent to the budget bill, and referring it to the country itself for judgment, thereby, in theory, making it illegal to collect taxes and carry on the King's government. The House of Commons will dissolve and go to the country.

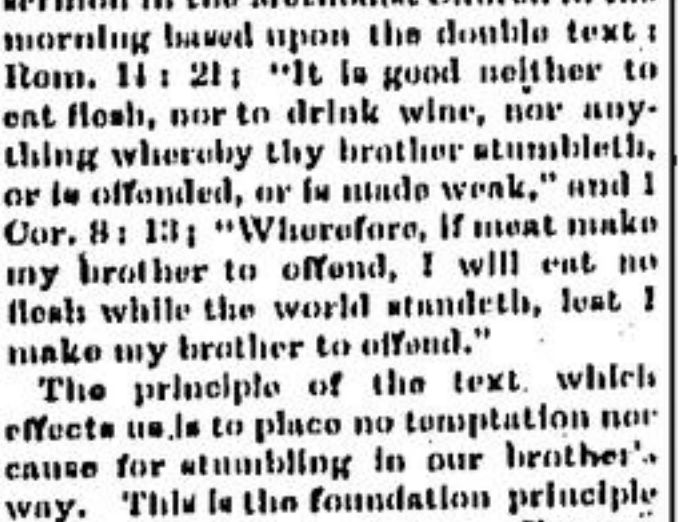

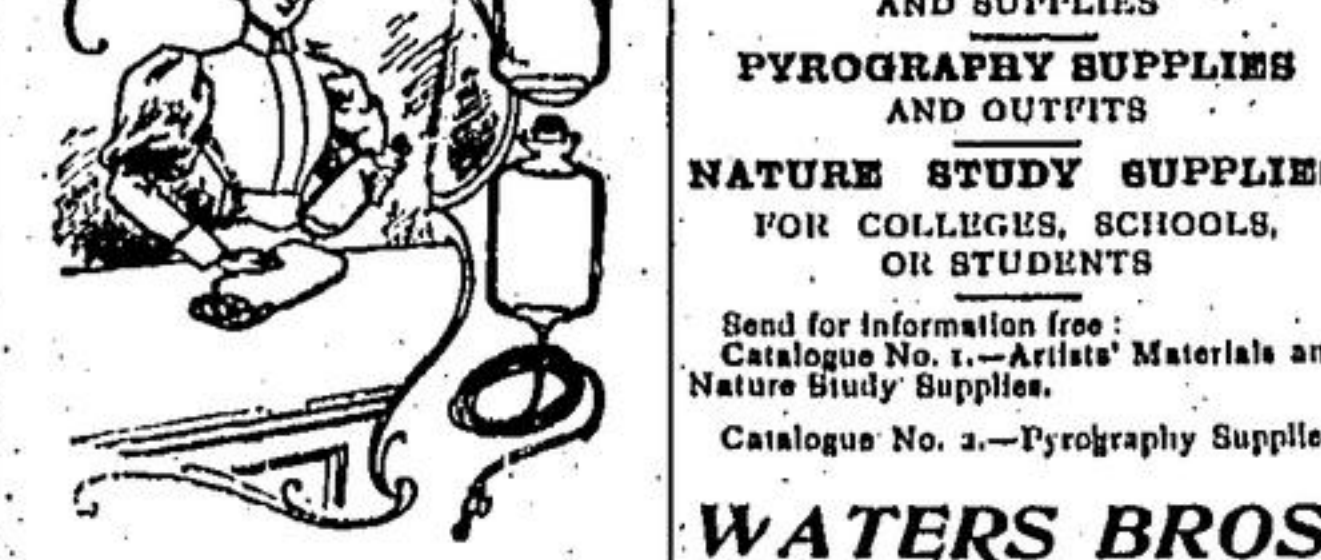
