EDITORIAL NOTES

"My duty is to work for a strong and respected country. They say that the Province of Quebec would have the right to find fault with me if I should not be made worthy of the British Empire in the face of the world."—Sir Wilfrid Laurier last week.

The fight against the weed evil, an evil which every year costs the farmers of the Dominion millions of dollars and has rendered valuable acreages of land, is to receive fresh impetus in the House of Commons this session. Important amendments to the seed and new legislation with regard to the use of weed seeds is foreshadowed and will be introduced in the House shortly.

During the last seven months of the present fiscal year, the Province of Quebec has increased its total income by nearly ten million dollars, a record which has not been equaled since 1922. The imports and exports of the Province for the year will run close to the eight hundred million mark. An encouraging feature of the situation is that the largest increase was in October, which showed a trade balance of \$10,000,000 over October, 1929.

It was immediately predicted, in many quarters, that prices would be advanced, that on account of the big merger the cement would have to pay dear for his cement in future. The first move on the part of the cement Company was to regulate the price of its product, and it was an agreeable surprise to everyone when it was learned that in making the adjustment prices were not unduly advanced. That was last year. On the 1st November, this year, a circular was sent out by the Canadian Cement Company, further reducing the price of its product throughout the entire Dominion on an average of about 10c per barrel.
