**EDITORIAL NOTES**

Young Canada stands for sobriety. The arts and graduates of McGill are to be congratulated on their decision to abstain from liquor at their banquet Monday night.

W. J. Gordon, Provincial Inspector of Prisons, at Ottawa, says that the bar-keepers and hotel-keepers all over the province are living up to the law better than they have ever done before.

The initiative was taken by the directors and shareholders of the Toronto Bank at the annual meeting on Tuesday in a movement from which banking circles for an efficient independent inspection.

That the Government has under consideration an supplementary estimate, appropriations which really mean the commencement of work upon the Georgian Bay Canal System, has been learned.

The new form of marriage license which is now being issued by the Deputy Registrar (General) is a decided improvement upon the one in use for several years.

During the past year the amount of railway construction completed was surprisingly large. In Western Canada more than 1,200 miles of new grades were built, being divided amongst the different companies as follows:—Grand Trunk Pacific, 350 miles; Canadian Northern, 380 miles; C. P. R., 200 miles.

For the protection of property the Council has deemed it to be expedient to extend the fire limits. To this end the fire limits by-law was amended at the meeting on Monday evening to cover all buildings within the limits of the corporation.

The Legislature of Ontario is in session. Tuesday afternoon, while the guns of the 9th Field Battery were slowly booming out the salute, His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, Hon. J. M. Gibson, attended by the Hon. J. G. Macdonald and his cabinet, entered the Legislative chamber.

**DR. BRIGGS' ELOQUENT SERMONS**

At the Sixty-Sixth Anniversary of the Methodist Church

**AT LAST SUNDAY'S SERVICES**

Rev. Wm. Briggs, D. D., Toronto, the popular Book Steward of the Methodist Church, is always cordially invited when engaged in preach in Acton. It was the preacher at the sixty-sixth anniversary services last Sunday and his discourses were, as usual, able, eloquent and impressive.

The sermon in the morning was based upon Phil. 1: 21, "For me to live is Christ." He said this expression of an old man of varied experiences, and was not given in a popular address before a friendly audience, but was written in prison and in bonds.

The study of his vocabulary is the study of theology. The thoughts expressed in the mind of this apostolic enthusiast were, first, suppression of self, and second, absolute devotedness to the Saviour. Selfishness is the prevailing sin of human nature. Only Divine grace can overcome it.

The control of all his being was in the Saviour's hands. His character was not only applicable to apostolic times, but is just as applicable to-day. Living for Christ is no hindrance to legitimate social duties, nor to diligence in business, but is a great manly principle which Christ's followers everywhere should adopt as Paul did.

The evening discourse was founded on John 1: 15 to end of chapter. It was an important part of the record of events at the beginning of our Lord's ministry. True religion is the result of personal contact with Christ.

As soon as he had found the Saviour, Andrew brought Simon Peter, his brother. The Kewas spirit, was in Andrew's testimony. There is nothing the world needs so much to-day as the man who has accepted Christ and knows he is pardoned.

The usual money by-law, authorizing the borrowing of money for general expenses, was passed.
