TO THE ELECTORS OF HALTON: Under the reciprocity treaty made in 1854 and abrogated by the United States in 1866, the British Provinces that now comprise Eastern Canada during the first thirty years of Confederation...

After fifteen years it has come. The United States have worked out to a logical conclusion the policy of trade restriction with the result that the public, producers and consumers alike, are at the mercy of enormously rich and powerful special interests.

Canada promptly declined it in regard to manufactured goods in general. The arrangement that has been arrived at is an agreement, terminable at any time, by either party, providing for the free exchange of natural products and the reduction of the duty on a few manufactured articles, principally farm implements.

Before, however, considering whether or not increased opportunities for doing business will put anything into our pockets, we should ask ourselves whether or not this increased business will detract from our loyalty.
