Powers Discussed at Connell Mostlux

For several weeks the matter securing Hydro Bleet ric connection for cton has been freely discussed, owing to the dangerously over-loaded condition of the local municipal lighting plant. Hon. Mr. Beck was bere at the request of the Council late in October and explained the fessibility of Hydro-

Electric connection. The engineers of the commission have made beveral visits to Acton to secure data and general information upon which have estimates of cost. The past week or so representatives of producer gas plant manufacturers have been here to mpress members of the Council and interested citizens with the greater conomy of their systems. 


