ONLY TWO TRUSTEES ELECTED

The nomination proceedings at noon Friday were as quiet and slimly attended as usual. Until a quarter to one less than a dozen ratepayers had put in an appearance, and when the hour had elapsed and Returning Officer Mackinnon declared the time for nomination had closed, the attendance was then less than a score.
