**EDITORIAL NOTES**

THE ACTON FREE PRESS should be advertised in a local newspaper before the ceremony could be performed, as a check upon clerical marriages, in the somewhat radical suggestion the Registrar-General of Ontario makes in his annual report on births, marriages and deaths.

BETWEEN now and next session the License Department of the Provincial Government will take up the consideration of regulation to enforce the anti-liquor law. These will be submitted to the House next session, when the Liquor License Act, in its amended form, comes up.

THE GOVERNMENT has decided to inaugurate a night lettering or deferred message service, over all Government-owned telegraph lines in the Dominion. This change for five words will be the same as the regular rate for ten words, with a minimum charge of twenty-five cents, and corresponding reduction for additional words.
