As an Insurance Address
Rev. H. A. Fish, Grand Chaplain of the U. O. A BEMBO WAR

London, September 10th.—The "War in East Africa" which is the culmination of this year's army manoeuvres started on Monday and the King who arrives in the manoeuvre area each morning is following the course of operations throughout.
