**ESQUING TOWNSHIP COUNCIL**  
No Ward Taxes, damages to be paid Underwood Taxes to be removed  
**THE TAX RATE IS \$4.60 MILLS**

At the last meeting of Esquing Council it was decided upon motion of Councillors Bingham and Cox that no bonus be paid for the erection of any wireless station to be built in the town if the same has been erected.

The tax by-law fixed the rate for the year at 4 mills on the dollar, for county purposes, 3 mills on the dollar for township purposes, 2 1/2 mills for General School Rate, 9 1/2 mills in all.

The tax collectors were appointed as follows:—Ward No. 1, Robert Joyce; Ward No. 2, Henry May; Ward No. 3, Geo. H. Thompson; Ward No. 4, Peter Gibbons; Ward No. 5, John W. Nickell; Ward No. 6, Edward Green sword. They will receive the sum of \$5 each for their services.
