The tobacco and sulphur dip is the same as that used for sheep scab-that in there should be sufficient extract of tobacco or picotine solution to give a mixture containing not less than tive one-hundredthe of I per cent of pleatine and sufficient suppour to give a 3 per cent solution.

The lime and emphur dip contains more lime than when made up for the treatment of sheep scab. It should contain twelve pounds of unslaked lime and twenty-four pounds of flowers of sulphur to 100 gallons of water. Both these solutions may be obtained ready compounded in the market.

Remedy For Sheep Maggets. An Ohio sheep raiser advises the use of gasoline in getting the maggots out of the wool on sheep and lambe when they are infested. Hwe lambs. eaght to be kept tagged from the first, however young, and any wether lambs that get solled should be tagged at odce. Sheep with neglected sore front feet (foot rot) often get bedly infested back of the shoulder because coutaminated by the foot when the sheep lies down. All such conditions, of course, result from neglect. These conditions usually come about doring harvest. when the farmer is too busy to watch his sheep closely. As they are actual conditions that will always be with us and with which any practical farmer can sympathise, the proposal of an efficient remedy is as much in order as preaching about prevention. 
