MENDING MATTING

When a Wern Place Appears Darr With Strands of Raffla. "Matting is such an unhandy thing to work with!" excisioned a young bousekeeper who was trying to mend a hole that had been worn through the maiting on the bedroom floor. "It's impossible to sew it, and if

tack a patch over this hole it will look untidy and will be kicked up at the edges in a few days anyway." That is partly true. Matting is difficult to work with, and tacked on patches are unsightly, but it can be sewed if you go about the nawing property and use raths instead of thread.

Rama can be bought by the bank in colors that correspond with the colors in the matting or in "natural" color, which matches the groundwork in nearly all the mattings. It costs but a few reats and will wear as long as the matting Itself. When a worn place of hole appears

in the matting it can be darned with threads or strapels or raffin. Use a long darning needle baving an elongated aye and work the strands of raffia in and out of the matting, the same as you would if you were darning a hole or torn place in any other material. When patching cut a place of matting several inches larger than the bole itself, taking care to match the figure in the patch with that in the matting on the floor; then lay the patch under the bole and darn the worn edges of the matting down to it, weaving the raffia in and out, over and under, using colors where colors in the figure in the matting demand and natural colored ratio on the groundwork.
