DO FLYING FISH FLY?

Science Thinks Not, but Many Ob-
servers Say They Do.

The much mooted question, "Do fly-
ing fish fly?" is discussed by William
Allingham in the Nautical Magazine.
The orthodox scientific opinion is that
the "wings" of the flying fish merely
serve as a parachute to maintain the fish
for a brief period in the air after he
has launched himself out of the water
by a powerful screw-like movement of
his tail. According to this view, the
fish has no power of directing his flight
after he has left the water.

However, Mr. Allingham, who is a
scientific expert attached to the British
hydrological office and is in constant
intercourse with seamen, reports many
observations that tend to controvert
this opinion. Certain observers claim
that the wing fins are in constant rapid
vibration and seem actually to serve
the purpose of flight. One vessel was
seen to take a fish that had attained an
altitude of twenty feet above the water
and was flying toward the mizzen rig-
ging of his ship when, apparently
suddenly, the fish changed its course
about 90 degrees, crossing the
vessel's stern to regain the water.
Many other similar observations are
mentioned in the Nautical Magazine.
