Friendly Letter Inviting Co-Operation to be Secured From the New Inspector

EFFICIENCY OF THE SCHOOLS IS SOUGHT

As a result of the disorganization of the electric power and lighting system at Oakville two deaths occurred by electrocution on Friday and Sunday. Mr. George Parker, an old resident of the town, was instantly killed in his stable on Friday evening when he grasped a flexible cord attached to which was a portable light.

Mr. Garfield George Till, of Toronto, who was visiting his brother, Mr. Louis Till, proprietor of the "Murray House," was similarly killed on Sunday morning when he went into the cellar to stop a leaking water tap and got hold of an electric light bulb. Death was instantaneous, and the unfortunate man's body was charred from head to foot.

In addition to the two men killed a large number of residents received shocks and were more or less slightly injured.

An electrical expert in Oakville and an inquest which opened on the body of Till on Monday was adjourned until Friday pending investigation. In the meantime the current has been shut off and the citizens have resorted to the use of coal oil for illuminating purposes.

Mr. H. V. Strickland of the Hydro-Electric Commission's Inspection Department, has made a thorough examination of the local system and claims to have solved the mystery surrounding the electrocutions. Mr. Strickland traces the trouble to the fact that the secondary wires which carry the lesser current for commercial use and private residences, was not grounded. He also explains that during the recent high winds the low and high tension wires became crossed, creating the short circuit which caused the electrocution.

Mr. Strickland says that recurrence of such accidents is impossible under the Hydro regulations, which call for the grounding of secondary wires.

All secondary wires are grounded under the Hydro installation in Acton.
