A CRESTED DINOSAUR Albarta's Antediluvian Constor Has Been Carefully Moduted.

Millions of years passed, the bones turned to stone and bundreds of feet of earth secumulated above them as the low-lying marshes were filled in, while the climate, thep subtropical, changed to temperate cold. Finally the Red River, a comparatively recent watercourse, began to out through these sediments, untaccous age, three or tappe million years ago. 
