The Baptist Church is arranging to install new furnace.

The roadway of Oakville's main street is likely to be paved.

The new bridge over the drain on Argyle Street has been completed.

A London droppier was fined \$100 and costs for selling liquor last week.

Half a dozen Georgetown men, including the Herald, are putting in Hydro power.

Guelph License Commissioners have refused a license to the Grand Central Hotel.

There were a number of very enjoyable Halloween parties in town on Friday night.

Two boys were fined \$10.50 each for throwing stones at the Hydro pole in Toronto on Friday.

Plans are in for all watercourses and such locations on the streets cleared out before frost sets in.

The electric railway graders are at work at the junction of Peel and Agnes Streets this week.

Mr. Thomas Hawer was burned to death in Guelph on Saturday while lighting a coal oil burner.

Councillor James L. Standish, of Kemptville, fell from a load of coals and had three ribs fractured the other day.

Miss Helen Loshinian, of Chicago has purchased from Mr. A. T. Brown his bungalow and three lots on Wellington Street.

COUNTRY TO ANIMALS

Twenty-nine cattle, crowded into a thirty two foot car, shipped by Drovers Campbell of West Toronto, for Chicago, were stopped at Ay by the Grand Trunk Railway authorities one day last week. These animals were dead, two had to be killed, and two disposed of. An information for cruelty to animals was filed.

The Town Improvement Society of Weston applied to the local council for the exclusive right to conduct a moving picture show in that corporation. All profits from the theatre would be devoted to beautifying the municipality. The council will consider the application before the election, probably in October.

Mr. Charles Stevens and family have removed from Toronto and are getting comfortably settled in the brick residence recently purchased from Mrs. James Ryden on Mill Street.

Hydro-Electricity Inc. Pergola and Elbow.

The towns of Pergola and Elbow both voted on Hydro-Electric by-laws. Maudsby and both cast their votes in favour of the by-laws. Elbow voted the vote in favour of the by-laws. Pergola voted for the by-laws, to 11 against. Elbow's by-law provides for contributions of \$100,000, and Elbow's \$100,000. The cost per h.p. quoted in the two towns is about \$20.00.

The Women's Institute Meeting.

The regular monthly meeting of the Woman's Institute will be held in the Guelph Chamber on Friday, November 7th, at three o'clock. The topics to be given are "Our Country's Resources," to be given by Mrs. Hawer, and "Noted Canadian Women," by Mrs. J. Stephenson, also a talk by Mrs. Harrie Rockwood. All funds raised will go to the Red Cross.

Town Councils are Dangerous.

During the process of cutting and filling on the east and west sides of Main Street, the contractors for the new electric railway removed the causeway. The work there caused a dangerous condition there being a drop of twelve to eighteen inches at these points.

The Council should see that at least temporary walks are put over these crossings at once for the safety and convenience of our citizens.

Oakville Town Hall Destroyed.

The annual convention of the Public School Trustees will be held in the Court House, Milton, on Friday, 14th inst. The programme includes addresses by Inspector Dailey, Dr. McNaughton, Dr. McLean, Mr. Gandy, of the Education Department; H. P. Moore, Acton; Ross Moore, Georgetown; and Rev. J. T. Kaye, Lowell. Discussions will be introduced by Messrs. W. H. Culmure, N. F. Lawrence, G. C. Davis, Chas. Headland, J. H. Standish, Thos. Michie, Frank Ford, J. G. Alton, J. R. Linday, Jas. Wright, W. L. Elliott and others. Matters relating to the schools, their management and government, and to the Education Department, will all be discussed. A permanent organization is proposed.

A Boy Burglar Jailed.

A number of burglar have been committed in Burlington lately. R. J. Dickenson's confectionery store was entered twice. Anticipating another visit Constable Troughton hid in it every night for a week, ending last Sunday night when he caught George Thompson, of Stoney Creek, riving the till. Thompson is about 15 years old. Before Revise Smith on Monday he admitted that he was a member of the gang that had committed the previous burglaries and gave the names of other members, who will be rounded up if possible. He said that they had intended to "pull off" a job in Guelph on Monday night, but had committed the trial and sought here to jail on Monday. He will be arraigned before Deputy Judge Killatt—Champion.
