EDITORIAL NOTES
The total immigration to Canada during the first ten months, April to January, of the current fiscal year, was 250,430, made up of 123,170 British, 123,826 American, and 103,434 from all other countries. The increase is three per cent.

It is frequently argued that license is necessary to insure properly constructed hotels. This hardly agrees with the press dispatch sent out from Woodstock saying: Five local hotelkeepers have been notified by the License Commissioners that they must have better hotels or else they will lose their licenses.

EDITORIAL NOTES
The Auditor-General's report shows that the Dominion Government in the last fiscal year paid the Ontario Province \$1,814 for advertising in the Catholic Register \$1,413; the Canadian Churchman, \$24.00; the Christian Guardian, \$22.70; and the Congregationalist, \$74.16. The Presbyterian and Westminster got nothing.

EDITORIAL NOTES
It has been predicted that the Canada Temperance Act will be submitted to the people of Ontario before the close of the next winter session. The vicarage of Huron, Welland and West counties will serve to stimulate the efforts of the temperance workers of this county to make the effort to place Ontario in the "dry" column.

EDITORIAL NOTES
The Ontario Legislature opened yesterday with the usual ceremonies. It is the third session of the present Legislature. It will be the first session in twenty-seven years since the late James Whitney will not be present. It is not all unlikely, however, that he will be seen in the House before the end of the session, so satisfactory has been his progress towards recovery during the past two weeks.

EDITORIAL NOTES
J. H. P. SUMMERS, the Conservative member for Peterborough, has given notice of a resolution that manufactured goods, and natural products coming into Canada from any other country where the rate of wages is lower than in the making or raising of the same in the United States, be subjected to a tariff duty sufficient to preserve the standard rate of wages of those employed in making or producing like goods and products.

EDITORIAL NOTES
The REACT of the province of the ballot case in the election on the Canada Temperance Act in Welland has so far been quite favorable to the supporters of the Act. Five ballots on which creases marked opposite "For the Act" had been returned and marked opposite "Against the Act," were found in the Coulburn ballot box. The temperance people are quite confident that the result of the scrutiny will be amply sufficient to have the measure carried in their favor and the act declared a law.

EDITORIAL NOTES
CANADA has the largest per capita millage in the world, the total being over 29,000 with nearly 10,000 mills additional under construction. Ontario ranks first with 9,000, which is about double the amount in the next rank, which has 4,511 mills. This indicates a very great increase in the millage of the province. Employees total 178,642, which involves a wage bill of \$118,750,000.
