## Lightning Rod Efficiency

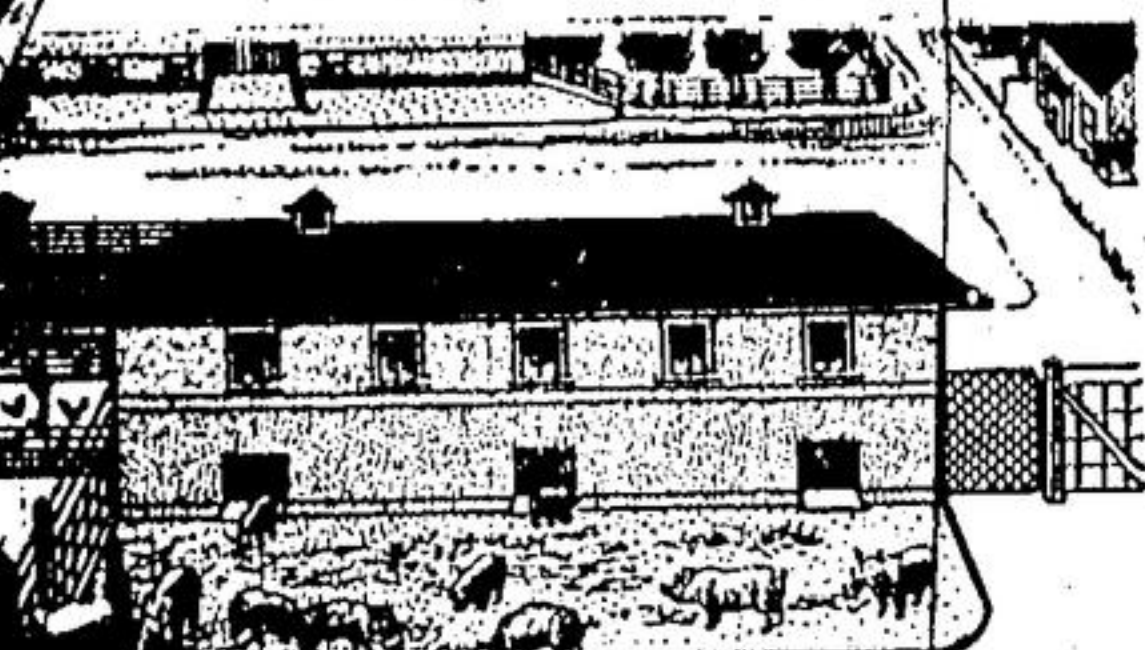
