Lightning Rod Efficiency

The Farmers' Mutual Lightning Protection Insurance Company of Michigan, as its name implies, insures only rodded buildings, and that only after the Company's inspectors have carefully examined the rodding and approved of it. During 1909-1912, this company paid out \$35,175.75 in a business which for the four years totalled \$55,475.75. In this Company paid out \$32.50 for damage to buildings by lightning, in three small claims, all traceable to defects in rodding, which were overlooked by the Company's inspector.


The Farmers' Mutual Fire Insurance Company, which also does business over the State of Michigan, insures both rodded and unrodded buildings. In the same four years, 1909-1912, this company, on a total risk of \$1,000,000, paid lightning damage to buildings to the extent of \$1,750, which is 100 times as much as the Farmers' Mutual did. Of this total damage to unrodded buildings, consisting mainly of farm buildings, 99 per cent. of their buildings were damaged. Considering these rodded risks, we see that the Farmers' Mutual occurred on unrodded risks amounting to \$1,750, the Farmers' Mutual would have to pay \$37.50, which is 116% more than the great loss on the same amount of properly rodded buildings. Thus, when the damage to properly rodded buildings amounts to \$1.00, the damage to unrodded amounts to \$168.00; or, in other words, rods have saved \$167 out of an expected loss of \$168, indicating an efficiency of 93.97 per cent., or \$99 out of \$100.
