### MR. NIXON DEFEATED

The result of the election on Monday returns the Government of Sir James Whitney with 83 seats. Mr. Rowell has 20, and there is one labor and one independent member.

The respective gains in the two parties are:

**LIBERAL**—North Brant, South Brant, Doon, (new riding), North Essex, South Essex, Lincoln (new riding), North Middlesex, East Ottawa, West Ottawa, West Peterborough, Prince Edward, Huron, Wellington, Windsor, (new riding)—12.

**CONSERVATIVE**—South Bruce, Haldimand, (new riding), East Lambton, Niagara Falls (new riding), South Ontario, Parkdale (new riding), Rivadale (new riding)—7.

Soldom in the history of the province has such keen interest been taken in an election.

The most notable feature in the polling was the reduction of the popular majorities of the Government candidates in the Province at large. In the last House the Conservative majority in the two Ottawa seats was 3,377. This has been changed to an aggregate Liberal majority of over 800. In the Midland counties there has been a steady, all-round reduction of Conservative majorities. The same tendency is observed in western Ontario, where, in the Waterloo, the Elgin and the Karto, the falling off has been most marked. In Toronto, too, where at the last election Liberals were simply overwhelmed, they put up a much better fight on this occasion than for many years past.

There was evidence of a concerted endeavor to defeat Mr. Rowell in North Oxford and Mr. Frostfoot in Bruce Haven. The reduction of Mr. Rowell's majority was accomplished by an extraordinary turnover of votes in the city of Woodstock where undoubtedly the liquor interests did effectively work against him.

The open bar remains. The people of Ontario have sent to the Legislature only one fourth of its members pledged to vote against the continuance of the law.

The Globe says: "Time is on the side of righteousness and justice and social progress. This election was only a skirmish. The real fight is not. It will be a fight to the finish."
