OUR SOLDIERS GET GOOD PAY

With Board and Clothes they get the Equivalent of \$12.70 per Week. THE MARRIED MEN GET MORE. The Government is treating our Canadian soldiers with commendable generosity in the matter of pay.

Many married men who have gone to the front may find that they receive more themselves and have more money for their families than if they stayed at home or if the world was at peace.

Canadian at the front are receiving \$11.00 a day, or \$77.00 a week. They have no expense for clothing or for board and no cost for tobacco is supplied free, there is no drain on the pay. In addition the family of the married man will receive \$3.00 a week by the decision of the Government, and if this is not sufficient to care for their needs there is the Patriotic Fund to look after them.

Many men who also receive their salaries while they are away. The Government, however, reserves the right to withhold the separation allowance.

Figuring that the soldier's clothing and board are worth \$3.00 a week, his soldier's job is equal to \$12.70 in money.

POPE BENEDETT XV
