—Word has been received by Alex Ward, Brantford, that his brother Jack was killed in action in Belgium on November 2nd. The late Jack Ward had been brought up in Brantford, and went to England at the time of the South African War, settling in the Northumberland Pufflers.

—The Officers of the Municipality of Kila Village, are not extravagantly paid. The salary's were fixed at last meeting as follows: Clerk \$45; Assessor and Collector \$40; Treasurer \$20; Medical Health Officer \$14; Auditors each \$3; Collector of Taxes \$10; Collector of Assessments \$10; and postman keeper, etc., \$20.

—Capt. Fitzgerald, who has been Guelph's assessor for the past ten years, except the two years that a Commission assessed the town, has honored his resignation. In 1903, Mr. Fitzgerald first took the position as assessor, and the town assessment was \$400,000 for that year. This year it will reach the \$2,000,000 mark.

—Passing of aged Ministers: Another aged minister, Rev. Marmaduke L. Pearson died in Toronto on Saturday. He had spent a lifetime in the Methodist ministry and was a speaker at the first Halton C. E. Convention held in Kitchener in 1883, when Rev. Dr. Dickson, of Guelph, recently deceased, was still a boy. Two venerable Presbyterian ministers in Guelph, Rev. Dr. Moore and Armstrong, who had each held high positions in the councils and service of Presbyterianism, died this week at nearly the same time. "Our fathers where are they, and the prophets, do they live for ever?"

—Guelph Presbytery Convocation: An outstandingly interesting and instructive convocation of the Women's Missionary Society of the Guelph Presbytery, was held in Guelph on Monday. The convention was largely attended, and thoughtful speakers delivered inspirational addresses, that gave the delegates an impetus to return and accomplish greater things.
