Storey & Son, Limited, Acton, which has been doing a large business throughout the Dominion for nearly half a century, has disposed of his interest in the company to Messrs. H. T. Arnold & Son, the glove men, of Georgetown.

Mr. Storey has been connected with the business for upwards of thirty years and has personally supervised his large and important institution for more than half that time, to the great advantage of the community. Being desirous now of taking a rest for a time from the exacting of the somewhat strenuous business activities which have been his since his early childhood, he decided to retire early in the year. The offer of this fine business opportunity attracted Mr. Arnold, of Georgetown, who is now surrounded by a quartette of vigorous sons, of practical training in the glove business. Being anxious for wider scope in business life, the Canada Glove Works have offered them an opportunity. Mr. Storey's terms were accepted, considered and finally met by them. His interests in the company were consequently transferred to the Messrs. Arnold at a meeting of the directors on Saturday.

The business will be continued under the company name of W. H. Storey & Son, Limited, whose reputation for honest, popular and satisfactory gloves is a household word throughout Canada.

Mr. H. T. Arnold has been in business in Canada for more than twenty-five years—ten or twelve in Acton and thirteen in Georgetown, and he and his sons are well qualified to continue the Canada Glove Works with the same vigour which has characterized it through its long history. **ST. ALBAN'S MEMORIAL SERVICE**

The Church closed last Sunday evening when Our Heroes Were Honored

**AN VERY IMPRESSIVE DISCOURSE**  
 The memorial service held in St. Alban's Church last Sunday evening in memory of the officers and men of the first Canadian Contingent who fell fighting for the Empire during the great battle of Langemarck was so largely attended the church was inadequate to accommodate the congregation that assembled.

The chorist and choir left very decorated with flags and patriotic colors.

Rev. H. H. Wilkinson, M. A., the pastor, preached a very impressive discourse on the unity of the empire, bearing his remarks on 1 Cor. 12:25, "And whether one member suffer, all the members suffer with it, or one member be honored, all the members rejoice with it." All the sections of the empire are now united in fighting to uphold the ideals for which the empire stands. Touching reference was made to the brave men who have fallen in the war.

Rev. Mr. Wilkinson referred to the resolution passed by the House of Bishops at their recent session at Fort William advising all the members of the Church to practice total abstinence during the war and to abstain from treating others, and recommended all his hearers to adopt this for their own rule of conduct.

Liquor is our enemy, he said, as the other enemy our soldiers are fighting.

**MAJOR BALLANTINE DOING WELL**

Cablegram Received by Mrs. Ballantyne Yesterday Morning

**EVERYBODY THANKFUL FOR THIS**  
 Great anxiety has been felt here for the outcome of the wounds sustained by Major Ballantine, Commandant of the Halton men of the first contingent, who was wounded in the great battle at Langemarck.

This anxiety was greatly relieved by the receipt yesterday morning by Mrs. Ballantyne of the following telegram:

London, May 4, 1915  
 To Mrs. Minnie Ballantyne:  
 Doing well.  
 (Signed) BALLANTINE.

In reply to a cable of enquiry by Mrs. Ballantyne early last week she received the assurance that her husband, Major J. Ballantine, of the 4th Battalion, who was reported on Monday as seriously wounded, but who had himself cabled on Sunday that he was safe, is now at Brompton Hospital. The cable states that the wound is slight. He was wounded by shrapnel and it is removed by ligature also, but his splendid physique and undaunted courage will be factors in his speedy recovery.

Mr. W. A. McLean, again in Penitence  
 As noted in these columns last week Mr. W. A. McLean, Barrister, Guelph, has resumed his professional duties. The Mercury says: "Mr. McLean carried on one of the largest and most successful practices in Guelph and Acton many years, and was recognized as one of the ablest members of the bar. On account of ill health he retired from practice and for some time has been travelling in the west. During the time Mr. McLean practiced he took a deep interest in all public matters, and was a leading member of the hospital board. Mr. McLean's office is in the property built and owned by him, known as McLean's block, on Douglas Street."

**Sidney Thurlow in the Yells**  
 Magistrate Thorne, of Penang, at Hillburg last Friday of selling liquor in the stable of Dexter's Hotel, and sentenced to four months in jail. Thurlow cleared out and went in hiding before the county jail at Guelph. He was, however, intercepted on Monday and is now behind the bars. Mrs. Dexter was sentenced to jail for a similar offence last month, but was liberated on parole in response to a largely-signed petition from Guelph. Thurlow has a record in Acton for illegal liquor selling. He was convicted before Justice H. P. Moore and A. E. Nicklin on January 12th, 1912, when acting as bartender of the Dominion Hotel, of illegal selling and fined \$50 and costs. It was shortly after this conviction that the full-scale of whiskey bottles was sent through the Pans Puss glass front and the plate glass counter top also smashed. On April 5th of the same year he was charged with selling from a pocket flask on the street, but evidence to convict was considered by the magistrate insufficient.

**Postage Stamps May be Used**  
 Enquiries having been received in regard to postage stamps being used for the payment of war duties on bank cheques, bills of exchange, promissory notes, express money orders, proprietary or patent medicines, perfumery, wine or champagne as well as upon letters and postcards, notice has been given that this use of postage stamps is in strict accordance with the provisions of the special War Revenue Act, 1915, which provides that postage stamps may be used in lieu of inland Revenue War Stamp provided that the discharge of any requirement under the Act that adhesive stamps be affixed. The public is at liberty at all times to use postage stamps for any purpose for which Revenue War Stamp are used, but it is especially provided in the Act that inland Revenue War Stamp are not to be used on letters, postcards, postal notes or Post Office money orders, the only stamps allowed on these being ordinary postage stamps of postage stamps upon which the words "War Tax" have been printed.
