



Extinction.

Unless immediate and radical action is taken by the governments of two widely separated countries. one of the most remarkable and picturesque members of the bird fumillos will soon become extinct. Canada alone cannot save the Eskimo curlow; it must have the hearty cooperation of the Argentine republic. The Eakline curlow is chiefly remarkable for the long annual migration; only two other birds exceed the distance covered every year by the curlow, and neither of these birds ever existed in the enormous numbers the curlow did until a few years ago. The curlow's migration covers as ellipse 6,000 miles long and 2,000 miles wide. This feat is surpassed only by the knot and the tern. But noithe, the knot nor the tern over was as numerous as were the curlows until a few years ago. They used to travel in enormous flocks. The frincipal breeding range of the curlow was on the Barren Grounds near the Arctic coast in the northern part of the Canadian province of
