These headsches come on periodically without any apparent cause. They are often called sick headaches. They run in families. Some women have them well into the prime of life and are in bed in a darkened room with them for a day or two every mouth. This form of headache is called migraine. It is often confined to one side of the head, or one the name homicrania. The best treatment is to use hot and


