MILITARY NOTES

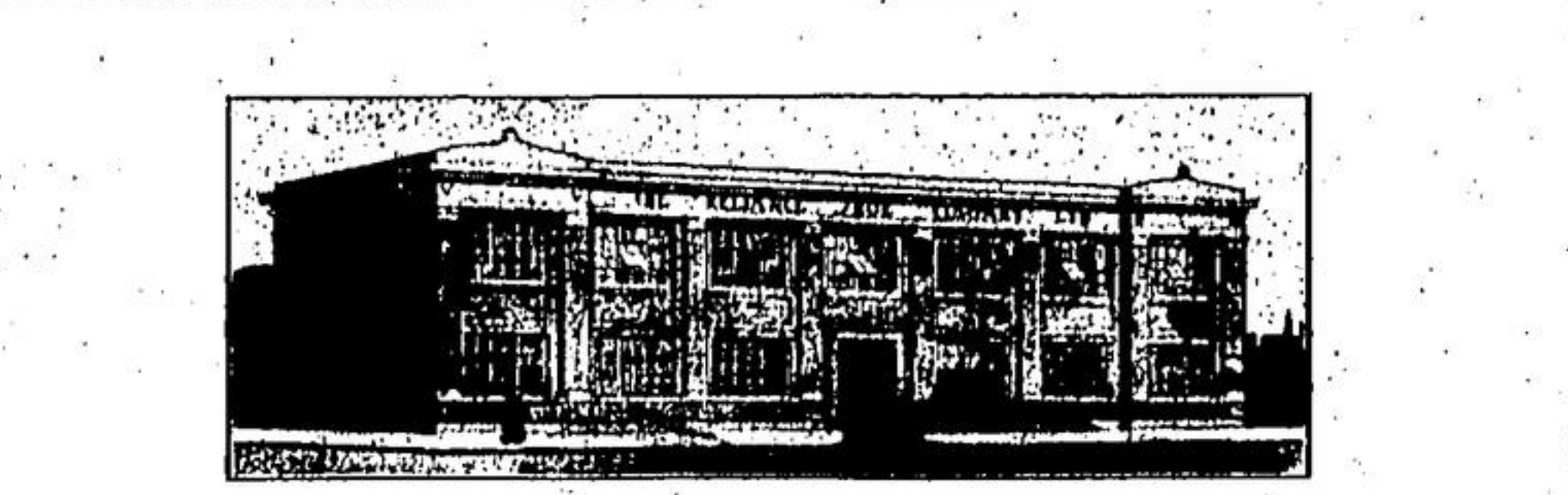

ACTON BOY KILLED IN TORONTO

Wallace Eldon Martin, son of Mrs. O. M. Martin, Car Checker in O. A. C. Yards
Wallace Eldon Martin, son of Mrs. O. M. Martin, Main Street, was almost instantly killed when struck by a passing train while checking cars on one of the Messy-Harris Company's sidings at Toronto, last Thursday. He was pulled up in an unbecoming position and rushed to Grace Hospital in a police ambulance. His injuries were of such a severe nature, however, that no time was held out for his recovery, and he died in a few minutes after being admitted. The body was removed to the City Morgue, where a coroner's inquest was held. An investigation into the tragedy during the afternoon. R. and the Ontario Percha Rubber Co., where he was formerly employed, and from the Parkdale Baptist Sunday School. Wallace Eldon Martin comes to Acton with his mother from San Francisco, Cal., three years ago. He was in his eighteenth year. Some months ago he went to Toronto and until he took the situation with the O. T. R. 18 days before the accident, he was employed at the Delta Books Building works. He came up on a week-end visit to see his mother the Sunday before his death. His mother feels her loss very keenly as the lad was a good son and very much attached to her.

Heavy attacks by Austrian troops were repulsed by the Italians. The British Bishop of Arras was decorated by the French Government. The Department of Agriculture announces a scheme designed to popularize sheep-raising. The Canadian Machine Telegraph Company's exchange and plant at Lindsay were burned, causing \$26,000 loss.
