NEWS TOPICS OF THE WEEK

WEDNESDAY. Harry K. Thies was yesterday adjudged a lunatic. The report that a submarine had suffered another collapse.

Further meetings of women, presided over by Mrs. J. H. Thies, were held at the Hotel de Ville in Toronto.

American hard coal producers have been warned not to fail to make summer reductions.

Sixty German submarines were reported to have been put out of business since January 1.

Sir Lyman Martin Jones' undertaking to second blood transfusion operations to save his life.

Major George Hodge Hood of Hodge's company, who was killed in the attack on the village of Hodge's, died at the age of 75.

John Mott, who was police magistrate of Fort Terry for thirty years, and a resident of that village, died at the age of 82.

Shipbuilding contracts let by the Imperial Munitions Board in Canada, for the construction of three new vessels, were put up for sale on the 11th.

The French Consul has been directed to call to the colors men who had previously been rejected, in order to release them for active service.

The Montreal Board of Trade passed a resolution calling upon the Federal Government to enforce the Military Act immediately and call out men for the defence of Canada.

Fire destroyed \$100,000 worth of property at the Cordova Gold Mines, owned and operated by three men who were caught in a late hour last night.

The report that a German submarine had been stranded near Hallowell, Ontario, in the St. Lawrence, is being investigated by the military authorities.

Mrs. Lathrop, wife of the Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Keewatin, died at Kenora.

General Borden, who was formerly for Droytes in the world famous trial, died at Paris.

The Duke of Connaught, who died of pneumonia, was buried in the Royal Chapel of St. George's, London.

General Barriol, the commander of the Allied troops in the country, will wed a nurse. The soldier is 64 years of age.

Premier Borden and General Borden were offered the freedom of Edinburgh, a unique honor for overseas soldiers.

General Louis Hoberg Lyman, Minister of War in the French Cabinet, resigned as a result of accidents in the Chamber of Deputies.

By a quick revolution in Russia, the members of the Duma assumed control and turned out the members of the Government suspected of being pro-Germans.

The Orange Order issued a manifesto in which they suggested that there should be taken against such strikers as left the country to avoid their duty in war time.

staro West concluded its annual session at Ottawa, and will meet at Chatham next year.

The Canadian Council of Agriculture asks \$1,500,000 for grain to be sold to the British Government, at a rate of \$1.70.

A large attended service of intercession for the cause of the Allies and their men at the front was held in Fort Erie, all business being suspended during the meeting.

French troops made notable gains in the Champagne region.

All German representatives in Ontario, including their passports, British and Russian troops continued their pursuit of the Turks in Asia Minor.

The colors of the 204th (Heavens) Battalion were deposited in the Legislature.

Regulations as to the wearing of uniforms by officers were laid down in an order in force in Ontario.

Toronto business men proposed to the Government that they release 100 men for work on Ontario farms.

Colin Levering, aged 35, and Henry Turpin, aged 27, were credited to death in a gravel pit at Foxgarden, Orillia township.

Surgeon-General Guy Carleton Jones, Commissioner of Canadian Medical Services, arrived in Ottawa on a six-months' leave of absence.

Free trade in a complete success, though it has not yet been decided whether the country will become a republic or a constitutional monarchy.

Harry Love, an American foreman at a Woodstock factory, was fined and reported to the United States for seducing a young girl employed in the mill.

After a discussion of economic questions in the Chamber of Deputies at Rome, a vote of confidence in the Italian Government was passed by a majority of 359 to 43.
