NEWS TOPICS OF THE WEEK

A large number of Canadian troops reached England safely, including eight battalions.

Mr. J. McManis, York Mills, has sold over his farm of 95 acres to the War Production Club.

Mr. E. H. Connelley, of the Toronto Harbour Commission, reports a plentiful crop of labor along the waterfront.

At a meeting of the Toronto Board of Health Assessor Maguire declared his opposition to a food dictator appointed by the "internees."

Port Burwell, a farmer, near Port Burwell, was found unconscious and bleeding much from a gunshot wound...

Ernest William Beckett, second Baron Grimthorpe, the well known English banker, died in London...

The City of Niagara Falls, Ont., will plant a potato patch, and will sell the potatoes to the citizens next fall.

Sir George Foster stated in the House of Commons that there were no war captives in Canada, and none would be created.

The labor and Socialist parties of the Allied Bank will hold a meeting in London next month to confer on the position of Russia.

Major-General Kurtzoff, commander of the Siberian Rifle Division, has been assassinated.

Ex-President Taft, addressing the Canadian Club at London, Ontario, predicted that the Argentine will be a large American army will be needed to help administer the finishing stroke.

The United States has arranged to make a loan of \$75,000,000 to Belgium, which will be repaid by the Belgian Relief Commission.

Heavy Austrian attacks were beaten back by the Italians.

A ship boiler was elected to the British House of Commons.

The Executive of District No. 13, United Mine Workers, has called a strike affecting about 6,000 coal miners in Alberta and British Columbia.

The Ontario Equal Franchise League invited to support only the best candidates and asked for the appointment of a returned soldier as superintendent of the jail farm.

Ontario Hydro-electric Commission officials advise against Windsor's buying out the W. & A. Street Railway at present.

The Ryndam, with the Austrian Ambassador to the United States and his party on board, sailed from Halifax, its destination having been completed.

Several North-western steamers were reported sunk.

The German Chancellor was the target for attacks by the Junkers and the Radicals.

Church leaders have issued a call for periodical days of prayer for repatriation and victory.

Toutons admitted that the British tanks and gas weapons were giving the Germans considerable trouble.

Before the Medical Commission, Surgeon-General J. T. Fotheringham said that the morale of soldiers was excellent.
