

BREAD AND MILK BY-LAWS

Were Passed at the Meeting of the Council on Monday Evening

THE LIST OF ACCOUNTS PASSED

Two important by-laws, which have been under consideration for some time, were passed at this session. They regulate the sale of bread and the production and sale of milk.

An application from Dr. H. A. Cox for permission to install a gasoline tank on Main Street adjacent to his property was granted.

Municipal Officer Hood was appointed Inspector for the Bread By-law and Dr. H. A. Cox for the Milk By-law.

THE DRAFT of the new selective conscription bill, introduced in the House of Commons by Premier Borden on Monday, is cleverly drafted and covers the situation generally as well as such a measure reasonably could.

Some clauses will no doubt be amended and improved during the debate, but in principle the bill must commend itself to the public generally. It is entitled to the authorities that allowing for exemptions and ineligible there are about 400,000 Canadians available for service in the ten classes.

It is believed that the first three classes will include unmarried men and widowers with no children between the ages of 20 and 34 inclusive, should be able to furnish the 100,000 or more now required, over and above exemptions and ineligible.

BY-LAW NO. 455

For Regulating milk produced for sale, offered for sale, or sold within the Municipality of Acton, passed in accordance with the provisions of Section 111 of the Ontario Milk Act.

The Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Acton enact as follows:

1. Milk cows must be kept clean and must not be allowed in any way.

2. Milk shall be sent to market or sold from any cow that has any ailment that would affect the quality or wholesomeness of the milk, and any cow subject to any ailment shall be removed and kept separate from the milking herd.

3. Only clean, wholesome food shall be given the milk cows. No strong flavored food which will affect the color or taste of the milk shall be fed to milk cows at any time.

4. All water supplied or available to milk cows for drinking, and all water used in cleaning utensils must be clean pure and protected from any danger of pollution.

5. The stable in which milk cows are kept, or in which they are milked, must be kept clean and in a sanitary condition and must be well-lighted and ventilated and so constructed as to be free from draft.

6. It must be provided with an efficient gutter which must be kept properly cleaned and kept open at all times.

7. Milkers must be in good health and must be cleanly dressed and personally clean at the time of milking and at any time while handling the milk.

8. Any milk in whose family any ailment occurs must be removed and kept separate from the stable or dairy until the ailment is removed and the milk is safe for him or her to return.

9. All milk utensils must be kept thoroughly clean and the process and of handling the milk in stable and milk house must be such as to insure a supply of clean fresh milk.

10. Milk must not be allowed to stand in the stable but shall at once be removed to the milk house, and cooled to a temperature of fifty degrees Fahrenheit and kept at or below that temperature until shipped.

11. All milk cans must be cleaned, light and sealed in the milk house before being sent forward to Acton from the milk house.

12. No milk shall be sold or offered for sale, or used for human consumption, the temperature of which is above fifty degrees Fahrenheit, or that contains bacteria which in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health is dangerous to health.

13. The Inspector may enter the premises whenever located of any person producing milk for sale or consumption within the Municipality, fully inspect the same, and take for examination and testing samples of milk produced therein and of the water supplied to cows or used in cleaning dairy utensils.

14. The Inspector may inspect and take samples of milk for sale or for consumption within the Municipality while in transit, and may enter any premises in order to procure samples of such milk.

15. All persons contravening any of the provisions of the Milk Act or this By-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten dollars or to imprisonment not exceeding one month, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

16. This By-law will come into force and effect on Monday, June 25th, 1917.
