He was nominated by J. R. Lindsay, of Esqueping, and John R. Watson, of Nassagawans.

Mr. Cleaver in his remarks expressed much appreciation of the honor which the people of this county in which he was born and had lived all his life had conferred on him by this nomination.

Mr. Cleaver reviewed at some length the provincial situation, criticising the extravagance of the Legislature in relation to the Government House, which thus far has cost over one million dollars.

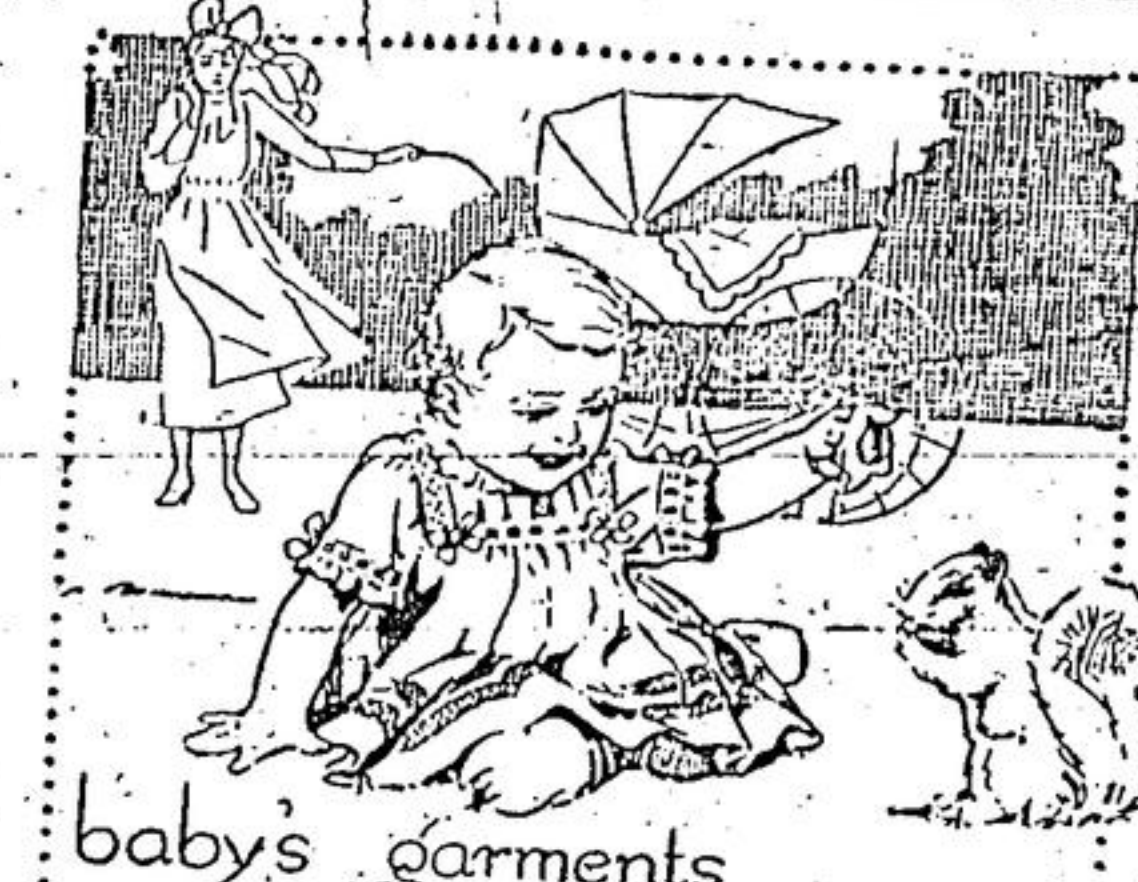
He also dealt with the granting of mining lands to the International Nickel Company made up of foreign capitalists, and the inadequate taxation of foreign corporations, as well as the confusion and financial mismanagement of the provincial government.

1. No more secret or private agreements whereby foreign corporations making immense profits allowed to pay low taxes than those fixed by the Legislature.

2. All motor vehicle licenses used to be kept in a separate account and used on the highways and in the rural sections, the counties to be used on the roads where their holders reside in addition to the provincial appropriations made, and the through roads to be kept up by the license fees paid by the cities, townships, and to be no charge on the rural municipalities.

3. The consulting of our recognized church organizations and our women's organizations in the matter of all legislation relating to the moral welfare of our province.

4. A prudent, economical administration of each department having in them the welfare of the people and of our democracy, with no more million dollar castles to be built out of the assets of the province.

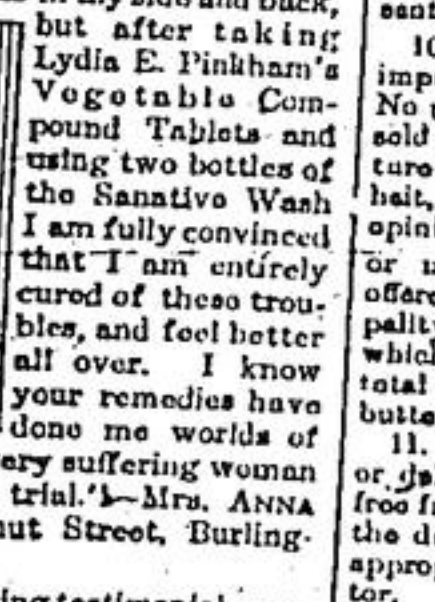

### BY-LAW NO. 455

For Regulating milk produced for sale, offered for sale, or sold within the Municipality of Acton, passed in accordance with the provisions of Section 111 of the Ontario Milk Act.

The Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Acton enact as follows:  
1. Milk cows must be kept clean and must not be abused in any way.

2. No milk shall be sent forward or sold from any cow that has any ailment that would affect the quality or wholesomeness of the milk, and any cow subject to any ailment shall be removed and kept separate from the milking herd.

3. Only clean wholesome food shall be given the milk cows. No strong flavored food which will affect the odor or taste of the milk shall be fed to milk cows at any time.

4. All water supplied or available to milk cows for drinking, and all water used in cleaning utensils must be clean, pure and protected from any source of pollution.

5. The stable in which any milk cows are kept, or in which they are milked, must be kept clean and in a sanitary condition. It must be well lighted and ventilated, and so constructed as to be free from dust. It must be provided with an efficient manure gutter which must be kept properly cleaned and emptied daily.

6. No milk shall be forwarded to Acton for sale obtained from any cow within five weeks before or within five days after calving.

7. Milkers must be in good health and must be cleanly dressed and personally clean at the time of milking and at any time while handling the milk.
