ACTON TRIBUNAL'S DECISIONS With to Date

Aeroplane Tragedy at Georgetown Tuesday

**Mrs. Wm. Cleave Instantly Killed
and a Number of Other Persons Injured**

THE PLANE TURNED AND RAN INTO THE CROWD

A tragedy of a most distressing character occurred at Georgetown shortly after five o'clock on Tuesday afternoon.

Between three and four o'clock an aeroplane arrived from the west and alighted in the field on the James Moore farm, west of the orchard. The airman discovered the machine was running short of gasoline and came down.

While the supply was being secured a large crowd of people gathered to inspect the flying machine. About five o'clock the operator announced that he was ready to proceed on his journey and requested the people to move away to places of safety.

He started eastward but evidently found he could not rise quickly enough to reach the orchard. Suddenly he turned sharply, the rapidly revolving machine dashed directly in front of the crowd of people which had been standing in the sun. Many of them fell flat to the ground and escaped the wings of the giant machine.

Unfortunately Mrs. William Cleave was in the direct course of the rushing machine. She was struck down and the heavy wheels of the plane passed over her, mortalling her body badly and causing instant death.

There were many narrow escapes and a number of the spectators received injuries. The little daughter of Mr. John B. MacKenzie sustained painful bruises. Mr. Cameron agent of the G. T. R. and his little daughter had a very narrow escape.

The airman is a cadet of the Royal Flying Corps. He had been at Stratford and was en route to Toronto. He was seen by us about Acton about ten minutes after three.

He was arrested by the Georgetown authorities pending an inquiry on the remains of Mrs. Cleave.

Mrs. Cleave was one of the most highly esteemed residents of Georgetown. Her husband has for years been prominent in local matters. She was an active worker in the Methodist Church.

No event in Georgetown has ever created greater consternation and sorrow, and the sympathy of all is felt for the sadly stricken husband and family.
