THE FIRST PIANOS

In our day, very few residences contain organs; but nearly every good residence contains a plane. In your great grandfather's day it was just the other way

The organ is a thousand years elder than the piane, for while a satisfactory church organ was in use as early as the year 608 it was not until 1709 that the first piano was built. At that time an Italian named Bartolommoo Cristofori made a pianoforto. He had been a builder of harpsichords, and he recognized the limitations of that instrument. The strings were picked by a quill, and no graduation of sound was pos sible. Cristoferi's invention of the "hammer action" made possible the modern piano, which nowiholds first place among all musical instruments. One of his early pianos is still preserved in Florence, and another is in the Metropolitan Museum in New York City.




