#### UNIVERSITY ATTENDANCE IN ENGLAND

The depletion of higher educational institutions in England due to the big war is clearly shown by the falling off in the entry of freshmen at Oxford University since 1914. Before the beginning of the war about one thousand freshmen entered the university each year. In 1914 the number fell to five hundred and fifty; in 1915, to two hundred and thirty-eight; in 1916, to one-hundred and fifty; and in 1917, to one hundred. Some of the few who have entered this year have already seen service at the front and have been discharged because of wounds or sickness. Until this year the American Rhodes scholars have helped to keep the numbers above the vanishing point, but these are now being called up for military service.



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
