This notice is to remain in force by the tenth day of May next, on which day the Sanitary Inspector will come to inspect the premises and further take notice that the section of the Public Health Act prohibiting the keeping of swine within the town of May and the 14th of November, except in pens at least 70 feet from any dwelling, shall be strictly enforced.

Four Questions in Prohibition Election

They May be Confusing but Ontario Electors will say Emphatically "No" to Each

NO BARROOMS—NEVER AGAIN

The Ontario Government has stated its position on the referendum on prohibition.

A short containing ballot will be submitted in September or October next bearing the following questions upon which the electors are to vote.

1. Are you in favor of the repeal of the Ontario Temperance Act?

2. Are you in favor of the sale of light beer, containing not more than 6.1% alcohol weight measure, under the Ontario Temperance Act?

3. Are you in favor of the sale of light beer, containing not more than 6.1% alcohol weight measure, under the Ontario Temperance Act to permit such sales?
