The Public Health

CITIZENS ARE REQUESTED TO COMPLY WITH THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT

Notice is hereby given that all residents of Acton are required forthwith to clean their closets, drains, yards, stoves, water closets, outbuildings and other premises, and remove therefrom all dirt, manure and other substance which may endanger the public health and to have the same inspected by the sanitary inspector on the 15th day of May and the 15th of November, except in cases where the sanitary inspector commences a general inspection, and further take notice that the section of the Public Health Act prohibiting the keeping of dogs between the 15th of May and the 15th of November, except in pens at least 70 feet from any dwelling house, and 10 feet from any street or lane, with floors kept clean from all standing water and regularly cleaned, will be strictly enforced. All citizens are earnestly requested to keep their premises constantly clean and thoroughly disinfected.

Historical Pageant by Daylight Saving Time Adopted Victoria Mission Band

An Excellent Production Presented in Knox Church on Good Friday Evening

A LARGE AUDIENCE PRESENT
The Historical Pageant given by the Victoria Mission Band on Good Friday evening in Knox Church was a great success and was enjoyed by a large audience. The church was prettily decorated for the occasion.

Practically eight o'clock a chorus of voices could be heard to the strains of music played by Miss Mae Willoughby, soprano and mezzo. The voices came until the columns of boys and girls were marching up the aisle to the front by the direction of Miss Willoughby, an opening chorus, "Ourselves Christian Soldiers," in a stirring and triumphant manner.

After a few remarks by the chairman, Rev. J. C. Wilson, D.D., "A Perfect Day" was sung by the Misses Wilson and Robertson. "To Canada," was recited by Horace Hald; "Hymn Chimes" was played by Olive Cooper; a dialogue, "The Doctor's Visit" was given by Arthur and Marjorie Lawson, and Dorothy Gardner; Jim Ross played on the violin, "Sweet in A"; "Gladness of Nature" was played by Jessie Mann; thus "Hearts of the World, Love Canada" was sung by the Victoria Mission Band, followed by the recitation, "In Praise of the Mother of the World," by the Victoria Mission Band.

This was followed by the recitation, which was not only symbolic, but showed the honor and glory of our country, Canada, both in the history of the early days and when great men and women, mostly of the French race, explored and developed this continent, and of what we are doing now and can do in the future.
