THE SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

FOR SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 5

TEMPERANCE LESSON (World's Temperance Sunday, Jan. 25, 1-8, 12-14, 18, 19)

Common Scripture Passage

1. The word which came unto Jeremiah from Jehovah in the days of Josiah, king of Judah, saying:

2. In the house of the Hechabites, which speak unto them, and bring them into the house of Jehovah, into one of the chambers, and give them wine to drink.

3. Then I took Jaazaniah the son of Jeremiah, the son of Habazzinjah, and his brethren, and all his sons, and the whole house of the Hechabites:

4. And I brought them into the house of Jehovah, in the chamber of the sons of Hanan, the son of Igdahiah, the man of God, which was by the chamber of Maaseiah the son of Shaltiel, the keeper of the threshold.

5. And I set before the sons of the house of the Hechabites bowls full of wine, and cups; and I said unto them, Drink ye wine.

6. And they said, We will drink no wine, for we are commanded, saying, Ye shall drink no wine, neither ye, nor your sons, for ever.

7. Neither shall ye build houses, nor sow seed, nor plant vineyards, nor have any; but all your days ye shall dwell in tents; that ye may live many days in the land wherein ye sojourn.

8. And I gave unto them the voice of Jehovah, our father, by all that he charged us, to drink no wine all our days, we, our wives, our sons, or our daughters:

9. Then came the word of Jehovah unto Jeremiah, saying:

10. Thus saith Jehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: Go, and say to the men of Judah, and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, Will ye not receive instruction to hearken to my words, saith Jehovah?

11. The words of Jehovah, the God of Israel, the God of our fathers, are in it, and we're teaching each other how to do it.

12. And Jeremiah said unto the house of the Hechabites, Thus saith Jehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: Because ye have obeyed the commandment of Jehovah your father, and kept all his precepts, and done according unto all that he commanded you:

13. Therefore thus saith Jehovah of hosts, the God of Israel: Jehovah our father, shall not stand before me for ever.

14. I will be a father to the fatherless, and a husband to the widow, saith Jehovah.

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GOOD FOR BUSINESS

LABOR THOUGHTS

In this story of the earliest total abstinence society, twenty hundred years ago, honor is given to certain great principles which, established in our land, will make this for ever a saloonless nation.

1. One great need of our time is parental authority. This is the chief need of the time. Parents should be firm and obedient to the commands of God, and should be obedient to the commands of their fathers and mothers.

2. Personal temperance in the language of the time means abstinence from strong drink. The tide of this prohibition is everywhere rising. The day is at hand when not a drop of liquor can be legally sold between the Atlantic and Pacific from the Lakes to the Gulf.

3. The prophet Jeremiah rebuked his people for not listening to God's messengers in Israel and Judah. We would that it were true by everyone. The people who study the Scriptures and follow its principles are the backbone of the temperance reform. Did anyone ever find a Bible-study club meeting in a saloon? Did anyone by reading the Bible receive to become a drinker of liquor?

4. The prophet pointed his people to the Arab tribes as obedient to their father Jehovah, while Judah and Israel had forsaken the service of their Father Jehovah. There is urgent need in our time of a more loyal service of God; not merely an outward church membership, but a personal church attendance, and the surrender of a heart to God's will and an obedience in His commands. If every citizen of our country were a doer of God's will, there would be little need of prohibitory laws; the judges would find their occupation gone, and many of the jails would be empty.
