Waterworks Commission
PROPOSED BY-LAW

To authorize the Delegation of the Control and Management of, and the Full Responsibility for the Waterworks System about to be constructed within the Village of Acton to a Commission under Section 34 of the Public Utilities Act.

SYNOPSIS OF BY-LAW
The purpose of the By-law is to appoint a Public Utilities Commission to manage and control the Waterworks. The Commission to consist of four members, and the names of the members to be subsequently nominated and elected by the ratepayers. The first election to elect two Commissioners for one year and two for two years, and thereafter two for two years. The Commissioners to be qualified ratepayers.
Take notice that the voters of the ratepayers of the said Village of Acton will be taken on the above mentioned proposed by-law on Monday, the fifth day of January, 1920, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the morning and continuing until five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day, at the following place and by the following Deputy Returning Officer, that is to say:

—Polling subdivision No. 1—At the Town Hall, with W. J. Gould, Deputy Returning Officer.
—Polling subdivision No. 2—At C. C. Hugel's shop, on Main Street, on Friday, the 13th day of December, 1919, the Reeve will attend at the Council Chamber in the Town Hall at ten o'clock in the forenoon to appoint in writing, signed by him, two persons to attend at the said polling place, and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this By-law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of supporting the passing of this By-law. The clerk of the Council of the said Village shall attend at the Town Hall, Acton, at 10:15 p.m., on the said fifth day of January, 1920, to sum up the number of votes given for and against this By-law.
