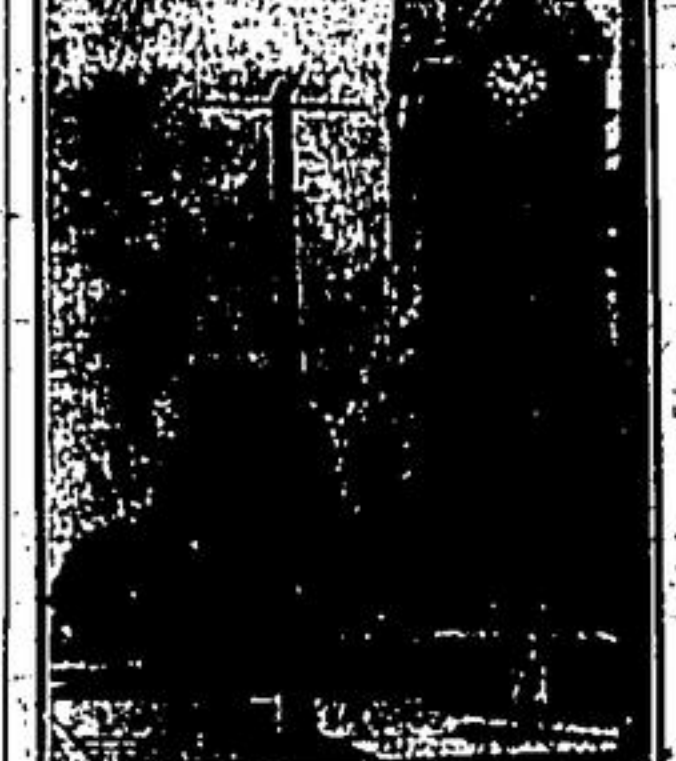

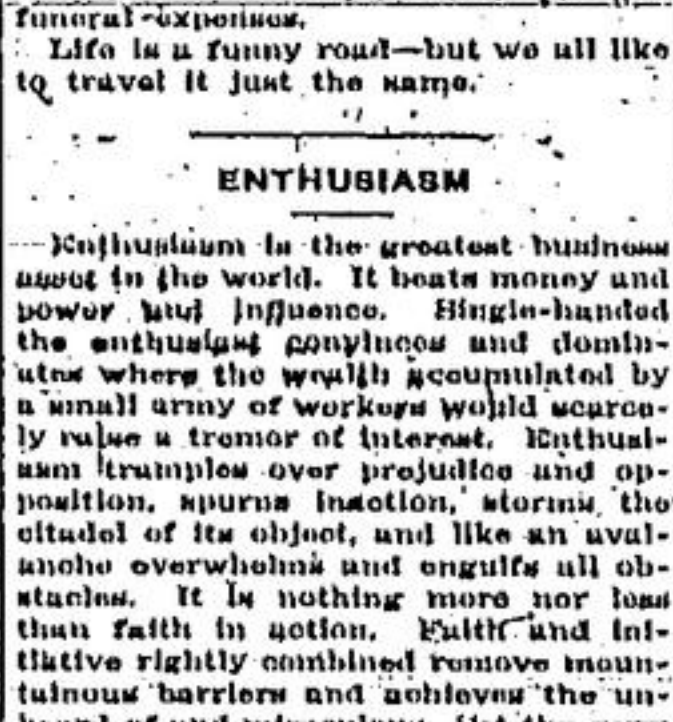

on or before the 30th of April, 1920. All persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows: 1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

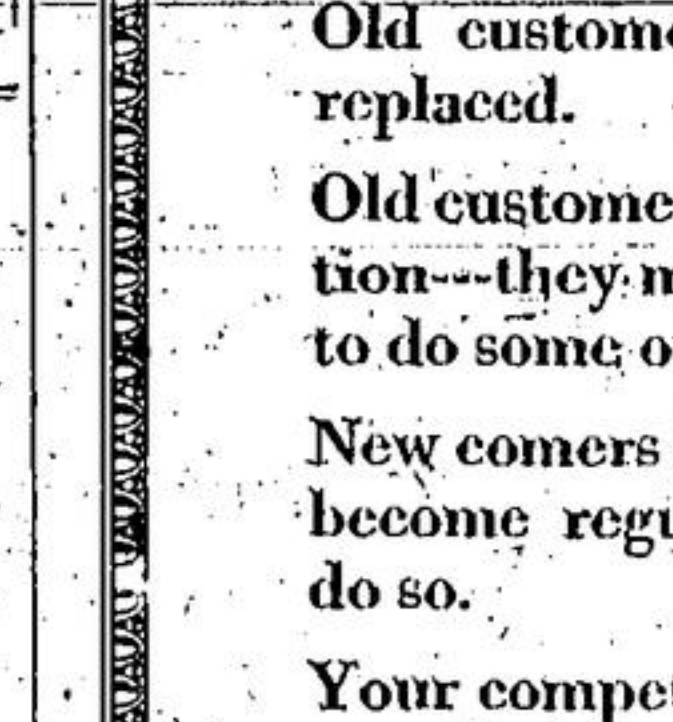
