Tenders for Laying Main Given to the Central Foundation Co. Toronto—Work to be Completed September 1st.

G. T. R. ENQUIRING FOR WATER SUPPLY

"At a special meeting of the Council on Friday afternoon, May 14, the Council and the Mountain Co. of Toronto, for the laying and covering of the pipe line, the waterworks, are recommended by the Waterworks Committee to be taken up at the earliest opportunity of the laying of the paving by September 15th of this year."
