Plan to Spend Forty Millions For Highways. Dominion Government Approves of Plans to Spend this Amount on Highways. INCLUDES HIGHWAY FROM TORONTO TO BARNIA. Plans that provide for the expenditure of \$40,000,000 to improve the highways of Ontario and Quebec are among those which have been contemplated by the Government under the operation of the Federal Highways Act... The Ontario plan provides for the following route highways: Windsor to the Quebec boundary at Coteau, via Chatham, London, Brantford, Hamilton, Toronto, Belleville and Kingston, with branches from Hamilton to Niagara Falls, and from Prescott to Ottawa... Port Hope, through Simcoe and St. Thomas to Windsor... Toronto to Barrie, via Brantford, Guelph and Stratford... Toronto to Muskoka... Ottawa to Pembroke, connecting with the road to Montreal... Ottawa to Kingston, via Perth and the Rideau Lakes... The plans of Quebec which have been approved are for the following routes: Hull to Montreal... Montreal to Lévis... Lévis to Rimouski... Rivière du Loup to Edmundston, connecting with the St. John Valley highway... Montreal to Sherbrooke, via Québec and Amqui... Montreal to Malbois, N. Y., via Châteauguay and Huntington... Montreal and the Laurentians to Mont Laurier... The present year will see work well advanced on many of these roads... Fined Two Hundred Dollars.
