More Sheep Are Being Killed by  
Worthless Dogs in the  
Township.

THE COUNCIL MEETS AGAIN ON  
DECEMBER 15

At the meeting of Esquimes Council last week the following business was transacted:

The treasurer was ordered to pay Mr. McMillan the sum of \$4 for operating his motor boat in the division; D. A. Nixon, D. L. S. for operating his boat, \$1.50; Peter Wiglesworth, \$1.45; Canada Ingot Iron Co., for one culvert, 14-inches by 18-feet; Wm. McDonald, \$250. Mr. McMillan's \$60 part payment on his bridge was rejected.

Henry Ferrier, for work done on first line, \$14 days with team and two men, \$30; Geo. T. Rogers \$7 for gravel pit; Mr. J. H. Devous, \$14 for work done on his bridge; Mr. J. H. McMillan, \$100. Mr. McMillan's \$100 part payment on his culvert was rejected.

John Hauck, for one culvert, \$15.00 being full account for building bridges on fifth opposite lot 20; Herbert Cook, \$1. McMillan's \$100 part payment on his culvert was rejected.

Fred Harrop, for the sum of \$27 for one cow and one lamb killed by dogs, was rejected as being valueless; J. H. Devous, \$14 for work done on his bridge, \$100 part payment on his culvert was rejected.
