The law to enforce the moving picture license law from this date, the age limit for permission to boys to enter a pool room was raised from 15 to 18 years in compliance with the statute; the milk license from \$1 to \$2.

A by-law providing for borrowing money for completion of the water-work system was introduced and read a first time.

Considerable discussion arose respecting the final account of Contractor Mackenzie for the shoe factory work. It was decided that the contractor should be paid on the basis of inspection of the factory on Tuesday afternoon.

At a meeting from the Teachers' Committee requested a refund for Town Hall rent for the 16th last.

The request was not favorably considered.

Chief Constable informed the Council that Samuel Blaisler was seriously ill with influenza, and that he needed an attendant day and night.

Mr. N. Barkman addressed the Council and asked for \$10 for damages from the accident last summer instead of the \$10 granted.

No action was taken.

The Dominion Engineering Agency made a proposition relative to advertising the shoe factory. The proposition was indefinite and was not entertained.
