

to-furnish-suitable-sell-conditions-for Uncultivated areas may be made sultable for the tree by supplying nitrogen in an available form early through the use of nitrate of soda and by using a mulch to conserve moisture, but on the whole the practice most suitable for general orchard preas is early cultivation followed by frequent cultivation at intervals of a week or ten days to the middle of June or July 1. after which orchard cultivation

The first cultivation may be shallow plowing, four or five inches deep, after which surface cultivation with 'he dies and smoothing harrow to maintain a surface mulch of tine earth is all that is required. Doop cultivation is not desirable, as the feeding roots naturally grow in the surface soil and deep cultivation may injure them. Shallow oultivation prevents the formation of a surface crust; thus checking excessive exaporation of moisture and retaining it for continuous growth of fruit, and insuring a proper moisture supply for the tree later in the season. As soon as the ground is dry enough after rain it is wise to start the hurrow, producing thereby a thick mulch. After the middle of June a cover crop should be sended to occupy the ground during the full; take up excess plant food, and develop humus for the following spring. The common votch seeded at the rate of 14 bushels per acre is the best cover grop. This plant can extruct nitrogen from the uir and increase the store of nitrogen as a result. This crop makes vigorous growth on most soils but will do better if the soil is limed. It is a crop fairly easily turned under and it is satisfactory at picking time, as it flattens down after making considerable growth. This cover crop may be plowed under in the fall or not until the
