SUMMER WORK IN THE ORCHARD

Summer work in the orchard may be divided among four different headings: spraying, cultivation, cover crop and thinning.

The first is a spring operation which it is usually necessary to carry on into the summer, and at least once a week should be put on after the fruit is well set on the trees.

Two or three weeks before the fruit is off, and may consist of Bordeaux or lime sulphur mixture with some arsenical poison added for biting insects and nicotine sulphate added for aphid control.

Cultivation and thinning should be continued until about July 1st, by maintaining a good dust mulch during early summer.

When the heavy drop of fruit is over, the orchard should be sprayed with some cover crop, such as rape, vetch, clover, or field pea.

The following rates of seeding per acre are recommended: buckwheat, 2 bushels; vetch, 2 bushels; clover, 15 pounds; summer vetch, 1 1/2 bushels; field peas, 1 1/2 bushels; rape, 2 1/2 bushels.

STORMS OF THE FILM

Maybe when you have seen the screen the deck of a ship during a storm at sea you have wondered just how it is done.

Anyone who steps to think has realized, of course, that it is not possible to take such a scene on a real ship during a genuine storm, for reasons of light and expense.

Concluding, therefore, that it is all done in the studio, you probably imagine a ship's deck built on huge rollers with the players staggering all over the place while the whole set tilts and teases.

That it doesn't. Only as much as necessary is built. It is kept wet with hosepipes. The waves shaking over the sides come out of buckets, and the rocking takes place only in the camera.

With an attachment between the camera and the tripod, the motion of the ship can be imparted to a stationary set merely by the camera man's assistant turning a handle.
