The appeal in the case of Norman William, in jail at Milton, under sentence of 18 months at Durwath Reformatory, on conviction by Police Clerk, was upheld by the Court of Appeal.

Mr. Eliot of the Municipal Board, Durwath, and Alexander Less, came up at Guelph Hall, Toronto, before Judge MacLaren, Hodges, McLeod, McMillan and Ferguson.
