Conservative Government Overthrown

W. L. Mackenzie King Sweeps the Country with a Majority Over All Parties

PREMIER MELCHON DEFEATED IN HIS OWN HIDING

With commendable candor the Mail and Empire announced the result of the election in its leader yesterday morning as follows: "We made our plea before the election and reaped our harvest. We do not propose to argue with the majority. They have spoken, and their verdict is against the Conservative Government."

The surprise of everybody in the Liberal ranks has been placed in power in the general election, and the Conservative Government has been overthrown and all other parties combined.

Mackenzie King, the Liberal leader, was himself returned with a big majority, and is supported by 123 Liberal members in the House of Commons.

Mr. T. A. Crerar, the leader of the Progressives, has a majority of about 5,000, and will have a strong following in the new House.

Premier Melchon's supporters admit that the Conservative Government was a failure. The result is a victory for the Liberal Government.
