The People Evidently Wanted a Change

The detailed returns of the recent general election, issued a few days ago, indicate clearly the strength of Canadian public sentiment against the late Dominion Government. Out of a total vote of 3,121,844, the forces opposing the Government, Liber uls und Progressives, obtained 2,066,110 Votes. Of this number 1,296,723 went to the Liberals. The Meighen Government was defeated by 1,004,508 votes, an overwhelming verdict which establishes record in Cunadian politics. The verdict was certainly decisive.


