It is only within recent years that much has come to be understood in regard to sound.

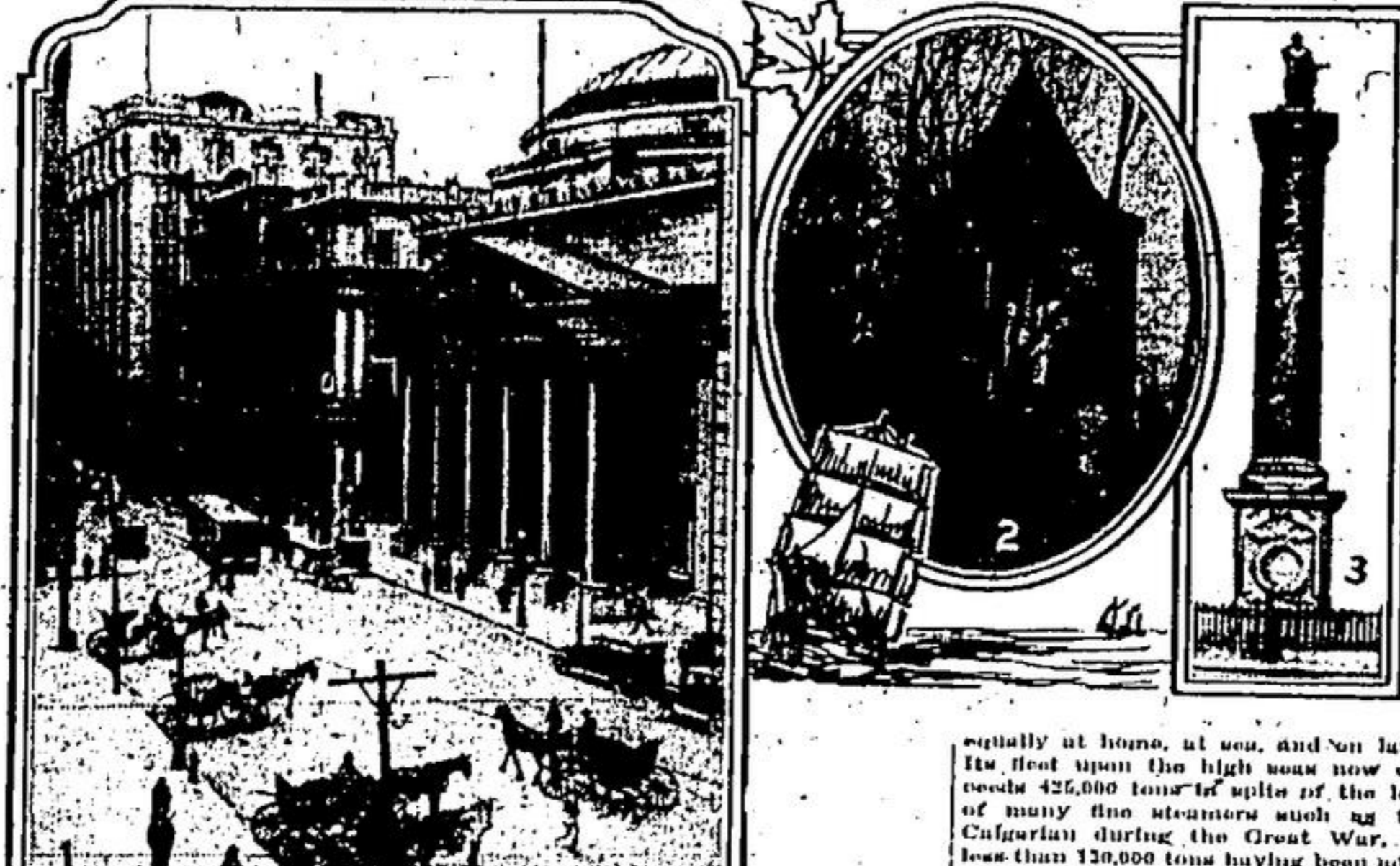
Formerly it was supposed that the vibrating of a string in a violin produced a sound wave which traveled through the air.
