

THE LORD'S DAY ACT celtion of Hotels, Restaurants, Refreshment Parlors, and Drug Stores In Relation Thereto

A widespread misunderstanding preulls with respect to the Hunday business, permissable in the above places. A careful consideration of the Lord's Day Act and a review of court decisions make clear the following: MEALS AND ACCOMMODATION

Mint-Restaurants or hotels may on Sunday legally conduct their proper business of providing meals or accommodation or both as the case may be. NO MERCHANTS TRADE Second -- These places may not on

RESTAURANTS ONLY Thirdly-Only a restaurant proper, that is a place equipped to give meals and regularly serving meals during the week may keep open on Bunday. Refreehment places not qualifying as restaurants as thus defined may not legally be open on the Lord's Day, their business being unnecessary. This consideration would apply to ordinary refreshment stands, los cream parlors, and to hotel bars.

HOTEL BARS Fourth-It has been assumed that duce the repeal of the license laws under which hotel bare were closed on the Lord's Day, these may now be open on Hunday and that since the license of standard hotels permits them to sell candies, cigars, cigarettes, this business, whether at the bar or elecwhere on the premises, may be conducted on Hunday. However, the sale of temperance drinks on Sunday is no more necessary than the sale of intoxicating drinks and had the sale of intoxicating drinks on Sunday not been prohibited by the license system, t would have been illegal under the Lord's Day Ant, and the license to soll candles, etc., does not carry with it the privilege of violating the Sunday law. No local or provincial ordinance an supersede the Lord's Day Act. .

FOR RELIEF OF SICKNESS fifth-The Sunday business of drug stores is limited under the Lord's Day Act 'to the sale of drugs, medicines, surgical appliances, necessary for the relief of sickness and auffering. A business in other articles such as candies, cigure, cigarettes, tobacco, kodaka, toilet articles, comes within the same prohibition imposed upon hotels and restaurants.-IL
