Verse 27.—The lesson here is similar from that suggested in the twenty-first verse. It is a warning for the man of bird and flower and tree by providing for their needs.

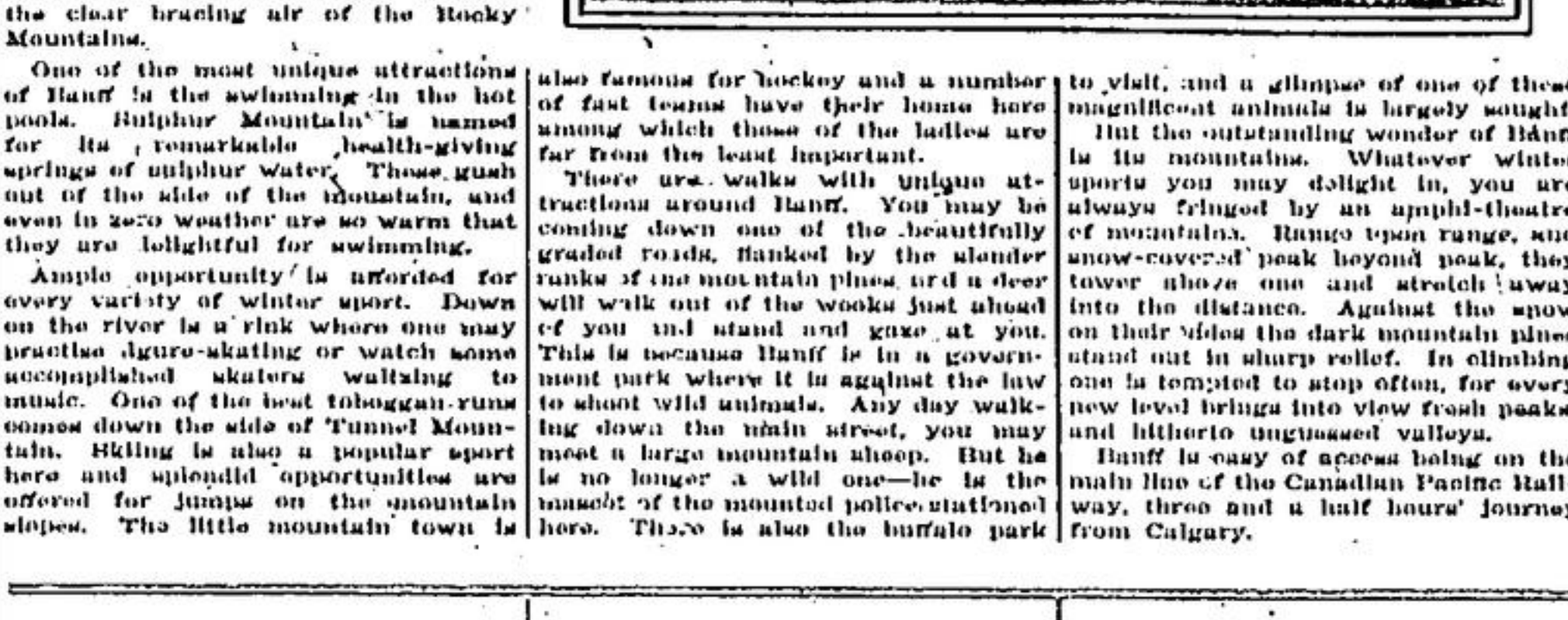

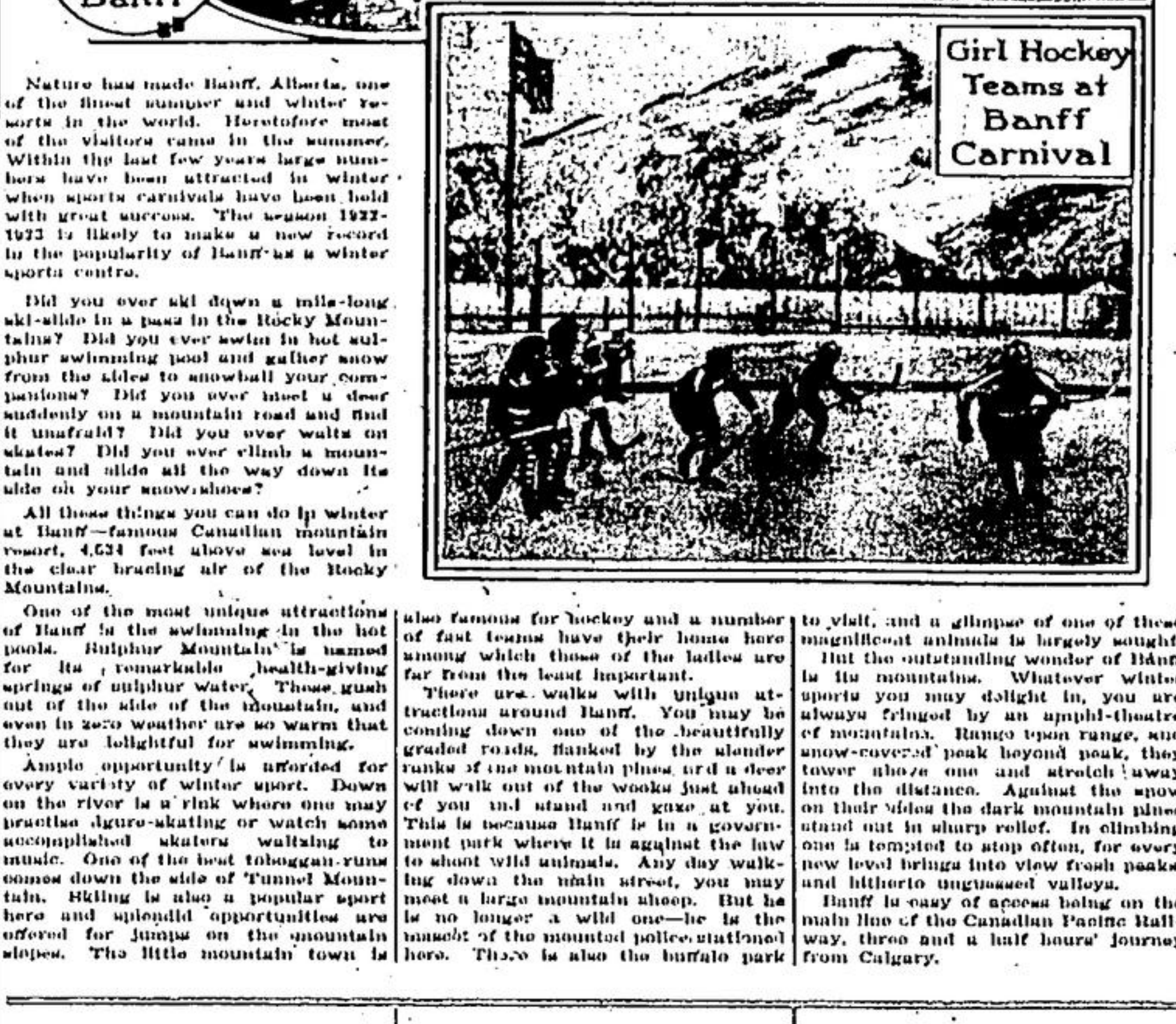
